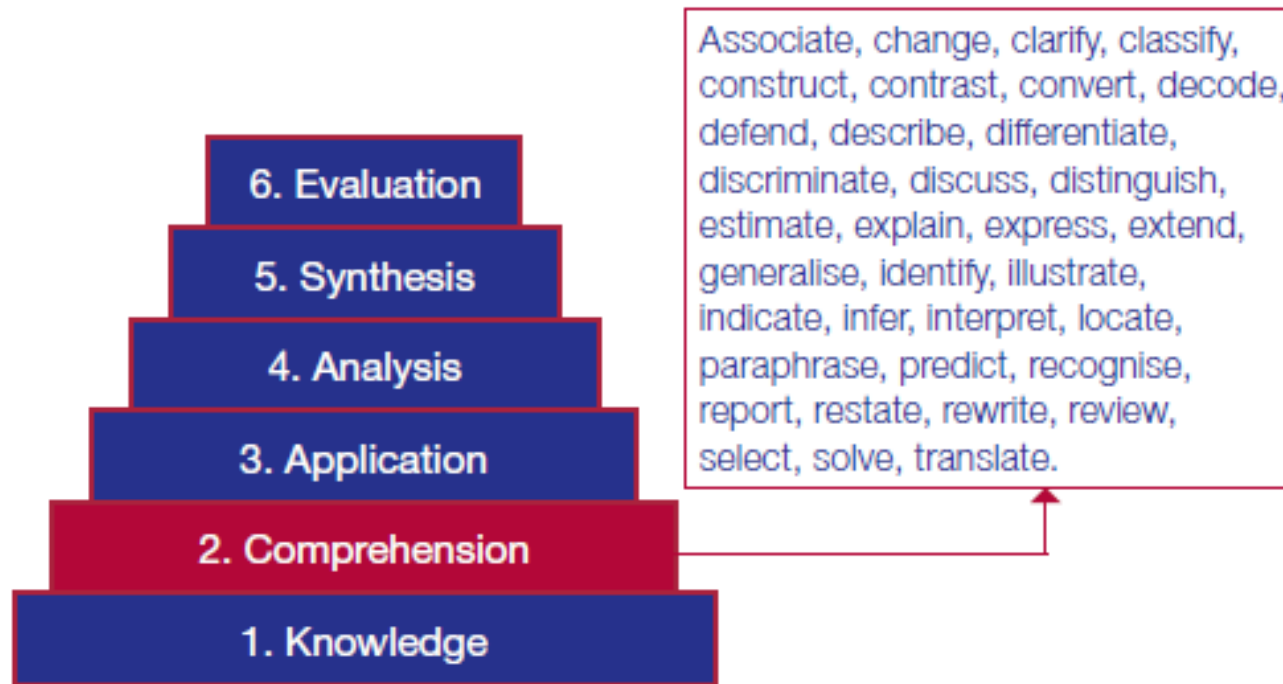
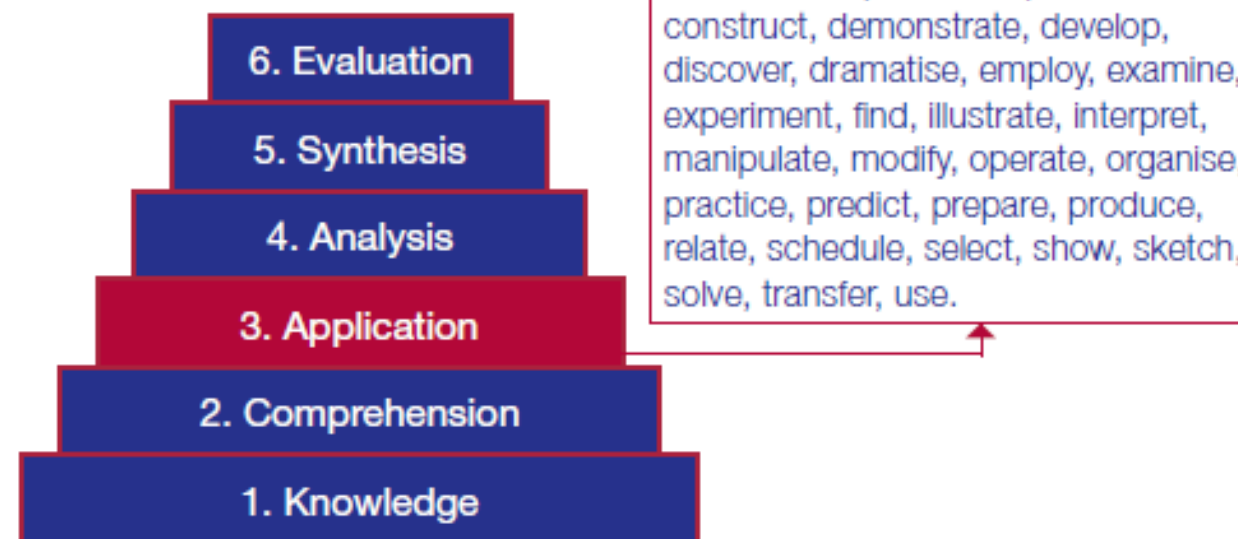


Fig. 3.4 Some action verbs used to assess comprehension
